Djilba

Djilba marks a transitional time during the year. It has some cold & clear days, along with warmer rainy & windy days. This is a great time to catch some djildjit (fish).

Kambarang

This season produces longer & warmer days with less rain. In full bloom are the *Djet* (types of flowers), along with plants that are collected & used for medicine, crafts, tools, *Mereny* (food), *Kaal* (fire) & ceremonies.

Baking with Gerry! (SWR Financial Counselor)



During the school holidays in October with support from the Social Work student Sam we provided an Adults and children baking session.



The session was for mums and kiddos to work together, but primarily for Mums to support and encourage the children and young people in this activity and for the children to have primary control over the shaping and decorating of the cookies.

The cookies were mixed from a recipe and not a packet, dough was formed by the hands of the children and rolled out then shaped or cut into shape with a variety of cutters. There were options of adding chocolate chips as well – just to add even more sugar! Icing was hand made with a vanilla or chocolate option and the choice of sprinkles seemed endless......as was the mess!

The uptake for this activity was better than any session before hand and the enthusiasm and excitement from the participants was contagious.

There were 9 participants, 5 young people ranging from 2-11. Not all adults who participated had young people with them but engaged in the process with just as much spirit as everyone else.

The verbal and non verbal communication from everyone was encouraging and supportive throughout the event and there was a genuine willingness to share resources and make sure all the young people were included and had a positive experience.

The kiddos were able to take a break while the cookies were baking and cooling before coming back to decorate and of course EAT their cookies and some even donated a special cookie or two to the staff who were helping.

A special mention to the young person whose Mum was having a challenging day and who made her a special heart shaped cookie, decorated with all the prettiest pink sprinkles and a massive amount of love and care. Oh and one more special mention to several young people who 'attempted' to help us clean the floor afterwards without any prompting.
